A celebrated tradition each week at Camp Mountaineer, Family Night is an opportunity for Scouts to show off what they have learned while at camp. Family and friends are invited to Camp Mountaineer Saturday evening to join Scouts for Closing Campfire.

Visitor Parking and Check-in/out Procedure

Parking is available for all visitors in the upper lot near the camp entrance. For the safety of Scouts and guests, driving into camp is limited. Only guests with a valid handicap placard displayed on their vehicle will be permitted to drive into camp.

All visitors to camp must first register at the Welcome Center and follow the same rules and expectations as participants. Visitors, who provide proof of completing the Scouting America's online [Youth Protection Training](#), will be given a wristband which must be worn at all times while in camp for identification. Visitors, without proof of Youth Protection Training, must be escorted by a Youth Protection Trained adult at all times while in camp. Camp terrain varies, so visitors should wear comfortable, closed-toe shoes. **All visitors must check out at the Welcome Center and depart by 10:00 PM.** See the Leaders Guide for more details.



Webelos Experience

Webelos Scouts will enjoy an extra night of camping following the Closing Campfire Saturday evening. Following breakfast on Sunday, Webelos Scouts will have the opportunity to explore the Ravine. The Ravine is the location of the natural rock face and is accessed by a short hike through the far reaches of the Camp Mountaineer property. It features many bouldering opportunities and provides the perfect place to explore more of what Camp Mountaineer has to offer as Scouts transition to the Scouts BSA program.
